ACCCR Update November, 2023

<u>The Voice, post Referendum</u>: ACCCR is developing a statement for the website to demonstrate solidarity with those who voted yes and to express support for any state and territory actions to provide voices and treaties. We encourage people to work with the already existing groups to further justice for First Nations Peoples.

<u>Requests for Support</u>: International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN, found at: <u>https://www.ican.org/</u>) and the NSW Bill on Gay conversion therapy. A majority of groups have responded positively to both requests to support these causes, including CCT, but ACCCR is following up is a few groups who have not yet replied.

<u>Formalising ACCCR</u> – Incorporation. Since ACCCR have considerable funds kept for us at present by CCCG which is an incorporated body, it was decided that we explore possibilities for incorporation of the Coalition itself. A lawyer who has worked with WATAC will be approached for advice. <u>Affiliation with We Are Church International and Spirit Unbounded.</u> Christina Reymer from We are Church New Zealand and ACCCR Exec. Member, has agreed to be our representative on both groups. ACCCR is seeking opportunities to network with lay and reform groups in the global south. It may be possible to link with groups associated with We are Church International and Spirit Unbounded.
